Kwazulu-Natal Flood Relief



PROJECT OVERVIEW

KwaZulu-Natal floods came without warning and have proven to be particularly destructive due to the region's steep terrain and narrow valleys, which has caused water to flow quickly and hence caused the devastating flash flooding of 2022. The KZN Flooding caused damage to the infrastructure, such as roads and bridges, and lead to landslides and erosion. It has caused serious consequences for people and communities, including loss of life, injury, and displacement.

In response to the crisis, Ashraful Aid International humanitarian organization, partnered with the Industrial Development Corporation (IDC) to provide aid to those affected by the floods. With the support of donors and other close partners, we were able to distribute food hampers to victims in rural areas of KZN. These hampers contained essential food items, such as rice, beans, and cooking oil, to help affected families meet their basic needs.

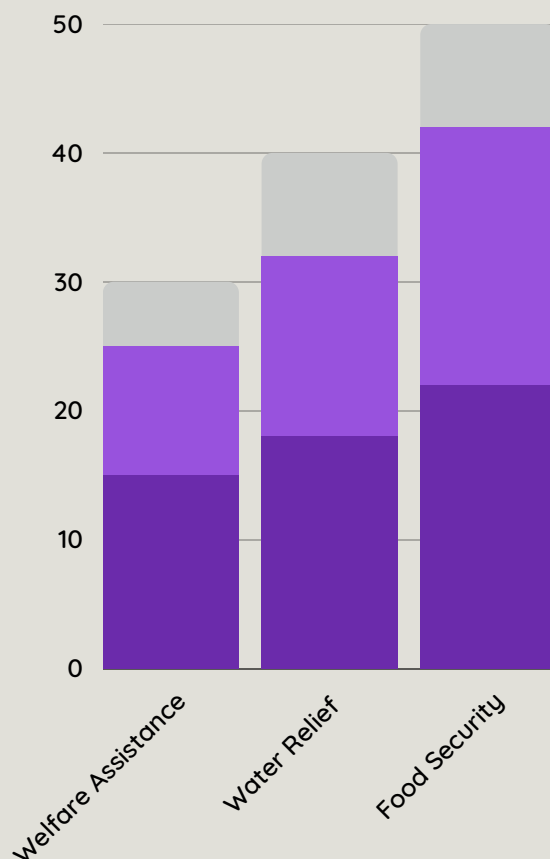
In addition to providing food aid, Ashraful Aid also worked to address the water shortage caused by the destruction of infrastructure. To alleviate the water crisis, we bored boreholes in affected areas to provide clean drinking water to those in need and supplied communities daily with 5-litre water bottles. we further

Through our efforts, Ashraful Aid was able to support a total of 20,000 beneficiaries in the KZN region. The organization's response to the floods was widely praised for its effectiveness and efficiency in providing aid to those affected by the crisis. Overall, the floods in KZN in 2022 were a major disaster, many people were able to receive the aid they needed to recover from the crisis through our efficient disaster relief services.



PROGRESS OF OUR PROJECTS

Ashraful Aid provided emergency relief to communities affected by the flooding, including access to clean water. They distributed bottled water or set up water purification systems to provide safe drinking water to affected communities, and also drilled boreholes in various communities to increase access to clean water. Ashraful Aid also provided food assistance, including the distribution of non-perishable items like rice, beans, and canned goods, as well as hot meals through community feeding centers. This assistance was critical during times of flooding, when affected communities may have struggled to access basic resources.

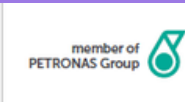

- Families were assisted daily with hot meals at evacuation shelters, emergency meals and hampers were distributed to beneficiaries
- thru this initiative we were able to assist over 50 000 people with clean drinking water
- Beneficiaries were given basic necessities to see to their daily life, most of these items were swept away by floods
